If you have a Category 2 RAP for a long-term project, providing you have met all permit conditions, you can use the RAP renewal form to renew this up to THREE times, after which you must submit a full application. If your work involves animal handling, as part of the renewal process you must submit up to date ethical approval EVERY year. Applicants should allow up to 60 days for a renewal to be processed. There is no renewal option for projects which work on the South Sandwich Islands.
